Ethiopia's **Terefa Delesa** ran the fastest 6-mile split at 4:32 ... It is the third-fastest time this millennium (last year's winner won in 28:18) ... His 29-second margin of victory is the largest since 2001, when Kenyans James Koskei and Joseph Kimani finished 1-2, but in 29:00 and 29:29.

USA's Aliphine Tuliamuk posted the 18th-fastest time (33:00), which is the third-fastest by a USA runner (trailing Elva Dryer, 32:51 in 2005 and Deena Drossin, 32:56 in 1999).

Notes: The **Ethiopia** men won for the 10th time in 22 International Team competitions (second straight), edging Tanzania by two points, tied for the third closest margin (last done in 2017, when the United States edged Ethiopia by two) ... Kenya, which has won seven men's titles, finished sixth, it's lowest-ever (sans two years when it didn't have one runner finish); however, with **Bernard Ngeno** winning, it marks the first time a team that finished as low as sixth had the individual champion (Morocco finished fifth in 2008 with the winner; and fourth in 2007 as well); all other years the winner has been in the top three ... The **Ethiopian** women won for the 13th time (10th in the last 11 years—finished second in 2016); the 16-point win over U.S.A. Red was the second largest in team competition history; trailing only a 26-point win by the U.S.A. over Romania in 2002 (it was the fifth time Ethiopia had a double-digit winning margin ... Both U.S.A. teams (men and women) were scored as follows: first three finishers comprised the "Red" team; the second three the "White" team and the final three the "Blue" team.

In the 26 years of the Push Rim (formerly wheelchair) competition, it was actually the third-slowest winning time ... **Jose Jimenez**, the 2016 champion, finished second for the third straight year ... **Cheri Madsen** won for the third time in the last four years and now has six top three finishes in the last seven Bolders ... Madsen's time of 28:23 was the fourth-slowest winning time as well; her 17 second win was the closest since 2014, when Amanda McGrory defeated Susannah Scaroni by 3 seconds.

Notes: The "podium" (top three) was dominated by Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference alumni: **Ian Butler**, who ran collegiately for Western State (now Western Colorado), took the lead within the first mile and gradually pulled away and ran solo until the final turn in Folsom Field; **Chandler Reid** (Adams State alumni) attempted to chase him down but came up short with another Adams State letterman grabbing third (**Kyle Masterson**) ... Butler ran the first mile in 4:53, and was consistent in all (4:55, 5:05, 5:00, 4:54, 5:02); Reid was able to close the gap finishing with 4:49 splits for miles 5 and 6 (the fastest splits in the citizen's race) ... **Nell Rojas**, daughter of the first BolderBoulder champion Ric Rojas, captured her first Bolder in 34:30.57, holding off a late charge from **Cleo Whiting** (Rojas was 62nd overall, Whiting 63rd) ... Rojas' fastest splits were mile 5 (5:21) and mile 4 (5:31); others were all between 5:34 and 5:41; Whiting's fastest was mile 5 (5:25) and mile 6 (5:30), with all her others between 5:34 and 5:41.
